Turner Bitton (Glendale Chair) opened the meeting at 7:06 pm

Item 1; Councilman **Andrew Johnson** – City Council

- Delay on 3 Creeks project -completion now next spring.
- City has a list of COVID Resources on its website <https://www.slc.gov/mayor/covid-19/>
- 9-Line RDA area adoption: 6 years now in process. SL Co and SLC School Board still have not agreed to tax increment sharing.
- Homeless population: Cleanup currently happening at hotspots

Item 2; **Josh Rebollo** - Community Liaison, Mayor's Office

- Storm debris crews are moving through neighborhoods. Free use of SL Valley Landfill until Sept 23.
- Winter COVID plan starting to take effect with homeless camp cleanups. \$1.6 m set aside for social services, minority businesses, housing assistance. 84104 and 84116 most hard hit.
- Commission on Racial Equality on Policing is conducting public meetings looking for public comments.

Item 3; **Angela Romero** –State Legislature

- Has been meeting with Dept of Public Safety on law and order issues; is prevention better than punishment? And Police Reform is being looked at.
- Angela will run a bill on de-escalation training.

Item 4; **Will Becker** – SLC Dept of Community and and Neighborhoods

- Presented the survey results and the draft solution for 900 W / California Ave intersection.

Item 5; **Nancy Montieth** – SLC Parks and Public Lands

- A new MasterPlan is proposed for the city open spaces with public input in 3 phases. Needs Assessment completed last April. Final draft of MP scheduled for Q2-3 2021.

- Showed the current state of the abandoned Raging Waters site -unsalvagable
- State of Utah Land & Water Conservation Fund (Fed funds) originally used, therefore outdoor recreation has to be site use in perpetuity.

Item 7; Det. **Eldon Oliver** -SLCPD

- 18.4% increase in crime citywide since COVID start (7.8% on west side)
- Property and gang related crime has increased in our neighborhood. Be Aware.

Item 8; **Ken Perko** -Sorenson Unity Center

- Sorenson Unity Center will undergo phased re-opening from Oct 6 onwards. Reservations will be required thru SL County online reservation system.
Masks required.
- Some Youth programs are open now during daytime.
